- There were no criminal incidents reported in the Sunset Mesa / Pacific View Estates area in last 50 days
- LAC Sheriff was dispatched to Kingsport regarding a report of a home burglary; this incident was related to an AIRBnB dispute not a home invasion

### **Initiatives Update**

- **Patrol** ADT client count remains flat vs. prior month at ~200; headwinds include broader inflation impact on household budgets. This remains a recommendation for homeowners and the board will work to facilitate an additional sign-up event details to follow. For membership sign-up please contact ACParrish@adt.com.
- Camera Surveillance The board has begun discussions about potential camera placement with a private homeowner in a strategic and legal location on private property along Coastline Drive. In addition, the Pacific View Estates board has indicated the desire to potentially contribute to funding of the camera and pool financial resources reducing the burden on the association. We expect to bring a proposal to review at an upcoming board meeting – likely August.

### Initiative Spotlight: NOAA Emergency Notifications

- Emergency Response Protocol Rick Silver, Emergency Preparedness Lead, successfully negotiated with the County to provide <u>100 NOAA Emergency Notification radios to SMPOA for FREE (\$4,000 value)</u>. These radios will be part of a broader pilot project to ensure the community is safely able to respond in the event of a disaster. These radios work when there is no power or cell service and send true emergency notification from the National Weather Service or other governmental agencies. These radios are incremental to the 2-way radio network the HOA is working to set-up in event of emergencies.
- If you would like a radio, please fill out the registration form that will be on the homepage of the Sunset Mesa website (sunsetmesa.org).
- Radios will be available for pick-up on August 8<sup>th</sup>. Priority will be given to residents who require assistance during an emergency as well as elderly or disabled residents.

Net Operating Income for June 2022 was net negative \$3,944. Revenue of \$3,905 includes 2022 dues, escrow document fees, past due balances closed out, and advertising revenue. Expense totaling \$7,849 comprise \$3,018 in legal fees, \$3,563 in CPA fees for 2020-2021 tax year filing and reconciliation, newsletter printing expenses Feb-May and the deposit for the Inspector of Elections servicing the Mesa Annual Election.

That said, a **gentle reminder that dues are not optional for membership benefits** in the Association including Architecture Committee support.


